Furloughs and Fiscal Challenges

As you have heard in the bulletin beginning in July your parish staff will begin taking furlough days in order for the Parish to have a balanced budget. Your finance committee and pastoral council sincerely hope that our Sunday offerings will be sufficient to delay the furloughs and restore the hours of ministry and service provided by your part time and full time staff. During the 2010-2011 budget year we will need 13,000 per week in Sunday stewardship offerings to balance the budget and relax the furloughs.

This week I attended the annual priest days meetings at Ocean Shores. We will be looking at ways to invite more parishioners to a deeper engagement with the parish.

This will literally be our last priest days with our current Archbishop, as he has submitted his retirement request to the Vatican. Bishops must submit their retirement request at 75.

THIS WEEK: STEWARDSHIP SIGHTINGS AT OLG

Stewardship Sighting(s)

What questions, thoughts, and comments do you have as you hear about the continuing development of our parish community? This second phase will focus on expanding the breadth and scope of our mission through a Parish Life Center / Gym to be built on the large parking lot just to the south of our Church. *Building for Our Future* meetings were held after each Mass last weekend, but the opportunity to comment is just beginning. Check out the site drawings in the Narthex and bring your questions, thoughts and comments forward and share them with parish leadership. Engaging in conversation and dialog about concerns as well as hopes and dreams is stewardship. Actively listening and seeking to understand the answers you receive is stewardship. Come and be a stewardship sighting.

Stewardship in Scripture

Stewardship has been described as the “pull and power of the Gospel come alive” by the US Bishops. Stewardship is grounded in the gospel message and as such it is reflected in some way in the readings (Old Testament, New Testament Letter, Gospel) we hear proclaimed each Sunday. Here is a look at one of the readings for this weekend through a “stewardship” lens.

June 27th (from Letter to Galatians)

“For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, *You shall love your neighbor as yourself.*” Paul repeats the very words used by Jesus about loving your neighbor. The whole of stewardship is fulfilled in living out this command to love neighbor as yourself. Said another way, embracing stewardship as a way of life leads to living this great commandment. Embracing stewardship and loving neighbor as yourself are mutually fulfilling.

PRAYERS OF REMEMBRANCE

If you are wondering about the new little box with the cross in the alter area. It is where all the Sunday envelopes with contributions made in remembrance of someone are going to be kept. They will be there for the month of the remembrance.

Look for it to be there holding Father’s Day names, plus any other names recently submitted. It will serve as a symbol to help us keep them all remembered in our prayers.

YOUR CAMPAIGN QUESTIONS ANSWERED

Last week's after-Mass receptions unveiled the architect's renderings of our new Parish Life Center and Gymnasium, generated lots of excitement and also gave us the opportunity to answer some questions from parishioners about the project and the *Building for Our Future Campaign* that will fund it.

Several of you had great suggestions for how we might use the building. We are logging every single idea and will also have volunteer opportunities and other meetings later this fall specifically to brainstorm building uses for all generations and purposes.

Others told us that when they donated to the first campaign, they believed the Parish Life Center/Gym would be built before our new Pastoral Center that houses administrative offices and meeting space. Unfortunately, the dilapidated 50-year-old building that housed our Parish offices fell into further disrepair and demanded immediate attention. We believed it was the most cost efficient and responsible move to build the Pastoral Center first. We apologize that we may not have communicated these needs as effectively as we could have when the decision was made.

And speaking of communication, within the next few weeks, we be setting up a Campaign website and developing other materials that will provide additional opportunities for you to get answers to your questions plus news and updates on the project and Campaign. Stay tuned to the Bulletin to learn when that new website will be ready.

"LETTUCE PRAY" PRODUCE COLLECTIONS RETURN TO OLG

"Lettuce Pray," the Sunday collection of fresh produce for local food banks, will be officially returning to OLG on July 4th. Weekly collections will run through Oct. 3rd. **If you would like to participate, please bring your donation (home grown or store/market bought) to church by 11:15 am.**

A couple of particulars to note this year: (1) Please bring soft produce (tomatoes, berries, etc.) in hard sided boxes (i.e. shoe boxes) & avoid bags when possible. And please, though they are tasty, no cherry tomatoes. Sadly, they all too often don't survive transport. (2) With regards to zucchini, smaller is better. Some people who utilize the food bank travel by bus and aren't able to carry other groceries along with a 5 lb zucchini.

"Lettuce Pray" is a program of Community Harvest of Southwest Seattle (CHoSS) in partnership with West Seattle religious communities to provide fresh, healthy fruits and vegetables to local food banks. Last year, "Lettuce Pray" congregations donated nearly 2 tons of fresh produce to West Seattle and White Center food banks. This year, we are shooting for the stars: we're hoping to collect 4 tons of produce. With your help, we can do it!
