Workshop On Changes To Mass

Later this month I will be attending a two day workshop on the revisions being made to the roman missal. I.E. the book that we use for saying mass. These revision will mean changes in what the presider and assembly say during our Eucharistic Celebrations. The changes will not be implemented until 2011. All parishes will be expected to have a preparation plan that educates every one on the changes, but also deepens our understanding of the full meaning of the Eucharist.

“Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not yet seen.” So begins the passage from the Letter to the Hebrews that was heard in every Catholic liturgy in the world the weekend of August 8th. The author goes on to say that it was this very faith that allowed Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Sarah to journey on the path to the Promised Land.

This passage has been lived in Catholic parishes and Christian Communities down through the ages just as it has been proclaimed. It is faith, that allows us the faith community formed through Our Lady of Guadalupe in Seattle WA – to move forward toward completing this next phase of building our community. It is faith that energized the parish founders as they began to lay the physical and spiritual foundation for OLG.

We have experienced this passage from Hebrews coming alive in our midst.
