THIS WEEK: STEWARDSHIP SIGHTINGS AT OLG

Stewardship Sighting

Stewardship involves receiving, sustaining, and passing on our Catholic Tradition. Catholic Social Teaching is central to our Tradition. Over the past seven weeks the themes that describe this teaching were explored in light of stewardship. Now we will add some examples of how these themes have been or might be lived out in our parish community.

Catholic Social Teaching on the Life and Dignity of the Human Person

"Every human person is created in the image and likeness of God. Therefore, each person's life and dignity must be respected. We believe that every human life is sacred from conception to natural death, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it protects and respects the life and dignity of the human person." It is easy to respect the dignity of a person we admire or like. It is difficult to respect the dignity of someone we do not like, do not like what they espouse, or even find repulsive. Respect for the human life and dignity of each person is not something that is earned or based on merit. It is based on our very creation in the image and likeness of God.

The general election will be in eleven (11) weeks. Respecting the human dignity of candidates and elected leaders with whom we disagree can be a challenge. These eleven weeks offer an opportunity to live this theme of Catholic Social Teaching: respecting the human dignity of all people.

Stewardship in Scripture

August 29th (from Book of Sirach)

"My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts." Sharing gifts of time, talent, and treasure in humility is the stewardship way of sharing. Being humble is not being timid. Being humble is recognizing that the source of all that we are able to offer is not us: the source is God.
