### White Center Community Lunch

9 am - 2:15 pm All Ages

Volunteers will prepare, deliver, set-up and serve a simple meal for 80 - 100 people. Meal prep will take place at OLG in the morning and delivered and served in White Center from 11:30-2:15pm.

### Nature Consortium - West Seattle

10 am - 2 pm All Ages

Nature Consortium is a grassroots, community-based organization whose mission is to connect people, arts and nature. Volunteers will be paired with one of the Nature Consortium's restoration staff, who will help lead invasive plant removal, mulching, planting and/or gardening activities in a park in West Seattle.

### World Relief Refugee Resettlement - Kent

10am-2pm. Ages 8 and up

Volunteers will help pick up and sort Welcome Kit items for newly arrived refugee families. Once restocked and organized, it will be easy for World Relief to quickly gather items and move families into fully furnished apartments. The day also includes a brief presentation on World Relief's work and the refugee resettlement process as well as the possibility of working with a settled refugee

### AIDNW (Advocates for Immigrants in Detention NW) Welcome Center

Outside the NW Detention Center - Tacoma

Volunteers will help sort donations and make toiletry kits for the Welcome Center, which offers safe release services and, social and community assimilation support to immigrants upon their release from the NW Detention Center. Volunteers will also get to meet with families visiting their detained loved ones and learn more about detention issues.

### Tri-Parish Food Bank - Burlington

8:30 am - 5:00 pm All ages

Volunteers will go to St. Charles in Burlington to help staff the Food Bank used by migrant workers and others in the area who are experiencing food insecurity. Volunteers also host activities for children while their parents shop. Volunteers have a chance to learn more about the realities of migrant life, interact with families and tour a migrant camp.

Transitional Resources - West Seattle  
10 am - 2 pm 16 and older

Transitional Resources is a West Seattle non-profit which provides supports to adults coping with persistent mental illnesses. They offer lifelong case management services and housing. Volunteers will help with gardening and grounds keeping at their agency on Avalon Way. Their staff will also share information about the services they provide to our community.

Santa Teresita - West Seattle

Santa Teresita is a Catholic Housing Services housing complex for low-income families who are at risk of homelessness. Volunteers will help lead the children and families in a variety of fun craft projects that will help beautify the grounds and common spaces.

Join us in the Walmesley Center to work on activities to help support young or growing families. A variety of stations will be set up for volunteers to make items that will be used by the OLG staff to give to families that are growing within our community.

Rainier Valley Food Bank

Rainier Valley Food Bank provides food to all who need it. Volunteers will distribute the food to customers and perform other tasks as needed.

Books to Prisoners strives to help incarcerated individuals by providing tools for education and self-fulfillment. Volunteers will answer request letters for books by locating the books and preparing them to be mailed.

Treehouse for Foster Children - Seattle

The Treehouse Warehouse is a free store where youth in foster care can shop for new and gently used clothing, books, games, toys, and other essentials. Volunteers will learn about Treehouse and how they help foster children. They will then sort donations from the community, tag and hang clothing, and complete other organizational tasks.
